AVP Basic Workshop Module 1 (July 15, 16, and 17th; 8:30 AM - 4:30PM)

Concentration: primary conflict resolution skills and creative alternatives to respond to conflict. Attendees will participate in experiential role playing as they work cooperatively to build community.
